ORDINANCE NO. 24-28

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CITY'S ANNUAL BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024.

WHEREAS, on August 23, 2023, the City Council adopted the City's Annual Budget for Fiscal Year 2024; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor has prepared an Amended Annual Budget for Fiscal Year 2024 and has submitted the same to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council held a public hearing on June 26, 2024 concerning such amended budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF WEST JORDAN, UTAH:

Section 1. The City Council hereby adopts the City's Amended Annual Budget for Fiscal Year 2024 which began on July 1, 2023 and ends on June 30, 2024 as shown in Exhibit A and summarized as follows:
